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Q. 16. What special act of providence did God exercise towards man, in the estate wherein he was created?

A. When God had created man, He entered into a covenant of works with him, upon condition of perfect obedience, forbidding him to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, upon pain of death.

Rules for Man

- One of the major objections to the “Covenant of Works” is that people say it teaches a works-based righteousness and that Adam could maintain his righteousness apart from grace
- This may be more a failing of the title than anything because “Covenant of Works” does *not* mean that Adam could earn anything apart from faith or grace
- Adam did not have to earn righteousness for he was created in a righteous state
- Nor could Adam fulfill the covenant apart from faith; had He fully trusted in God, He would not have sinned
- If we think about this in terms of Adam and Christ (the new Adam), Christ fulfilled the “Covenant of Works” (The Law) where Adam could not

- Read Genesis 3
- What was their sin?

The Hope of Grace

- Even in the curses, we still see God's grace
- Genesis 3:15 is what we call the *protoevangelium* or the first appearance of the Gospel
- In our study on Creation, we saw that the death of Jesus was God's eternal plan, and we see that plan being revealed here
- Even in the midst of their sin, God already was showing His mercy

The Nature of Fallen Man

- Whereas Adam was created in righteousness and was free, he is now a fallen creature
- Does he still bear the image of God?
 - He does, but the image has been corrupted
 - Notice the shift in Genesis 3:8-11
 - The man was not the way he was before
 - He does not even see the world in the same manner
- Man's nature was changed in the Fall from a holy creature to a defiled creature
- Let's look at what scripture says about the sinful nature of man

“ *Job 14:1–6 (ESV)*
14 *“Man who is born of a woman
 is few of days and full of trouble.
² He comes out like a flower and withers;
 he flees like a shadow and continues not.
³ And do you open your eyes on such a one
 and bring me into judgment with you?

Review

- The Holiness of God
- God created all things for His glory
- God is free to create however he pleases
- God is both sovereign and provident over Creation
- God created man in His image and man was free
- In his freedom, man chose to sin
- All of mankind has been corrupted
- We all die in Adam and are made sinful in Adam

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The Nature of Fallen Man

- *Original Sin* - Adam's guilt and fallen nature are *imputed* to his offspring
- *Imputed* – to charge or attribute something to a person's account
- *Adam's Imputed Sin* – This does not mean that we are guilty of Adam's sin and that our eternal judgment is based on Adam's sin
 - It means that we are under the judgment and condemnation of Adam
 - Adam is the only one to whom God has said, "Do this and you will die"
 - Death is the consequence of sin, but it is the consequence of the man who sinned under the command of God
- *Adam's Imputed Nature* – Man is born into a natural state of sin against God
 - Can anyone choose to **not** disobey God?

The Nature of Fallen Man

- Read Romans 5:12-21

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1 Corinthians 15:20–22 (ESV)

²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

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The Nature of Fallen Man

- A common statement made in objection to original sin is that it is not fair for man to be held to the sin of Adam when He did not commit the sin
- That's the entire point of the imputation of Christ's righteousness
- You did not do anything to earn it or gain it, yet it was given to you because of Christ's work
- Paul's entire argument for the imputation of righteousness is based on his argument for the imputation of Adam's sin

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The Nature of Fallen Man

- While we are sinful in Adam, how far has man fallen?
- To what degree has man become sinful?
- This is going to be the heart of the disagreements amongst Christians in Soteriology

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III. Of the Fall of Man

We believe that man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker, but by voluntary transgression fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners, not by constraint but choice; being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.

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New Hampshire Confession of 1833

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Chapter 6 – Of the Fall of Man, of Sin, and of the Punishment Thereof

P2. Our first parents, by this sin, fell from their original righteousness and communion with God, and we in them whereby death came upon all: all becoming dead in sin, and wholly defiled in all the faculties and parts of soul and body.

P3. They being the root, and by God's appointment, standing in the room and stead of all mankind, the guilt of the sin was imputed, and corrupted nature conveyed, to all their posterity descending from them by ordinary generation, being now conceived in sin, and by nature children of wrath, the servants of sin, the subjects of death, and all other miseries, spiritual, temporal, and eternal, unless the Lord Jesus set them free.

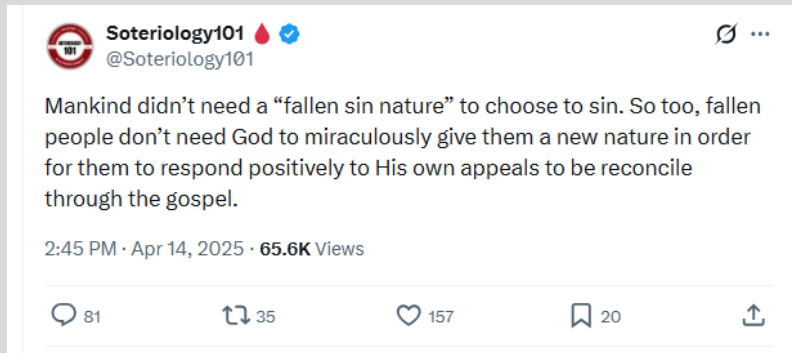
P4. From this original corruption, whereby we are utterly indisposed, disabled, and made opposite to all good, and wholly inclined to all evil, do proceed all actual transgressions.

- The question we are asking: Has man's nature fundamentally changed?
 - Are we in the same state in which Adam was created?
 - Did his fall into sin do something to our nature?
- If man's nature did not change in the Fall, then what happened in the Fall?
- Let's now look at what scripture says about man's sinful nature

The Nature of Fallen Man

- The constant teaching of scripture is that mankind is wicked to their very core, or *depraved*
- This does **not** mean that all men everywhere are as evil as they possibly can be
 - God restrains the sinfulness of mankind (Romans 1:18-31)
 - God sometimes looses this restraint in judgment
- It does mean that man is wholly sinful and wholly inclined to sin
- Man has no righteousness whatsoever apart from Christ
- Mankind is in slavery to sin

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*John 8:31-38 (ESV)**31 So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, “If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.” 33 They answered him, “We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, ‘You will become free’?”**34 Jesus answered them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin. 35 The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. 36 So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. 37 I know that you are offspring of Abraham; yet you seek to kill me because my word finds no place in you. 38 I speak of what I have seen with my Father, and you do what you have heard from your father.”*

The Slavery of Fallen Man

- Does man have *free will*?
- This has been a question that has caused many disagreements
- Some think that to say man has no free will is to say that man cannot make any decisions and is some sort of robotic person
- To say a person does not have free will is NOT to say that a person is unable by their own will to be righteous due to their sinful nature
 - Man sins of their own volition, and gladly at that
 - Can a man cease from sinning?
 - If he cannot, is his will truly free?
 - If man is unable to will themselves into a state of righteousness, is their will truly free?

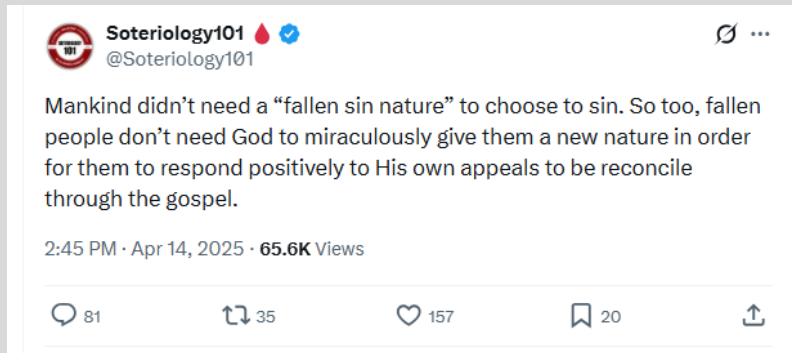
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The Slavery of Fallen Man

- The focus of Christian debate is really around the idea of *inability*
- All orthodox Christians agree that man cannot be righteous on his own without the work of God
- Is man so sinfully depraved that they do not have the ability to respond to the free offer of grace by their own will?
- John 6
- 1 Corinthians 2

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51

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Chapter 9 – Of Free Will

P1. God has endued the will of man with that natural liberty and power of acting upon choice, that it is neither forced, nor by any necessity of nature determined to do good or evil.

P2. Man, in his state of innocency, had freedom and power to will and to do that which was good and well-pleasing to God, but yet was unstable, so that he might fall from it.

P3. Man, by his fall into a state of sin, has wholly lost all ability of will to any spiritual good accompanying salvation; so as a natural man, being altogether averse from that good, and dead in sin, is not able by his own strength to convert himself, or to prepare himself thereunto.

P4. When God converts a sinner, and translates him into the state of grace, He frees him from his natural bondage under sin, and by His grace alone enables him freely to will and to do that which is spiritually good;8 yet so as that by reason of his remaining corruptions, he does not perfectly, nor only will, that which is good, but does also will that which is evil.

P5. This will of man is made perfectly and immutably free to good alone in the state of glory only.
